

Would have appreciated the demographic information to be sure the information corresponded with perceived neighborhoods. So have put together multiple maps with a few versions hoping to see how they are graded. Also want to be sure that if any were disqualified for one reason or another, that others put together differently would survive

The kit was a bit clunky, but here is my second attempt. Happy to hear feedback on any disqualifying features in time to update. Hoping can be graded before the next meeting on the subject to give time for potential revision.

Description:

Purple District - Central district surrounding Citrus Ave stretching north from Badillo. Encompassing the old down area and much of the 'old covina' feel.

Blue District - North West district surrounding Azusa highway and its influence. This area has a distinct set of demographic and income levels.

Green District - Southern edge bordering shopping districts and the freeway. Higher population of renters and multiple family properties.

Red District -Eastern Badillo corridor. Encompassing some of the highest income and property value homes in the city. Using the Railroad tracks as a divide east of Banna

Teal District - North East district. As distinct feel and build out separate from red or purple districts

I realize using the tracks between teal and red cut differently than the population grid, but it more accurately reflects the change of neighborhood. So the exact count for each will have to be calculated. These areas are mostly commercial with the exception of the north west corner of the 1,159 grid. Both districts should remain within allowed range

District voting order:

Using the most recent available data, it appears those up for election in 2024 currently reside in the red and blue districts. So those would remain in place for the cycle. Placing the purple, teal, and green districts up for 2022 vote.
