

While I am unconvinced the council will be better able to serve the city with 7 council members, it was easier to group fewer neighborhoods into more districts when drawing population balanced maps.

This maps breaks out a number of community of interests. First a freeway district south of Puente. A South Badillo district following nearly the entirety of the corridor through the city. An Eastern district that is comprised entirely in charter oak. A western district that surrounds Azusa south of Covina. A central district between the tracks and Badillo, Hollenbeck and Glendora, A district between Covina and Arrow highways west of Barranca, then finally a district north of the railroad through the city.

As far as order. I am unsure the best way to add 2 seats. Intuition would say a 3 / 4 split. But either one seat could be added in both 2022 and 2024, or both seats added in 2024 so the larger election times with the larger election year. This would also prevent a 6 member council in the interim. I will assign district order based on the assumption of 4 in 2024, but 1 of those could be pulled up if the other approach is taken

it would make sense to keep existing council members in cycle.

That places Purple in 2022. And the neighboring red district up in 2024.

To fill out the other 2022 seats, I would look to the historically unrepresented areas of town. In this case Orange to the west, and the lime green freeway district at the bottom of the map. With Blue, green, and light blue joining red in 2024.
